



AIRBALTIC GROWTH STORY CONTINUES ALSO IN FEBRUARY

The Latvian airline *airBaltic* in February 2018 has transported 215 839 passengers or 23% more than last year to its network spanning Europe, Scandinavia, Russia, CIS and the Middle East. This is a new record number of carried passengers in February in the history of the airline.

Martin Gauss, Chief Executive Officer of *airBaltic*: “It takes a lot of effort to improve our performance for so many months in a row. The airline continues its growth, and in the same time is improving the service offered to its passengers. As the most punctual airline in the world, we offer a truly reliable and convenient flying experience.”

In February 2018, the airline performed 3 485 flights, or 15% more than in the same period of 2017. The airline’s load factor, which represents the number of passengers as a proportion of the number of available seats, was at a level of 66% in February 2018.

The 15-minute flight punctuality indicator for *airBaltic* reached a level of 88.8% in February 2018. This means that more than 88 out of every 100 *airBaltic* flights departed at the planned time or with a delay of no more than 15 minutes.
