

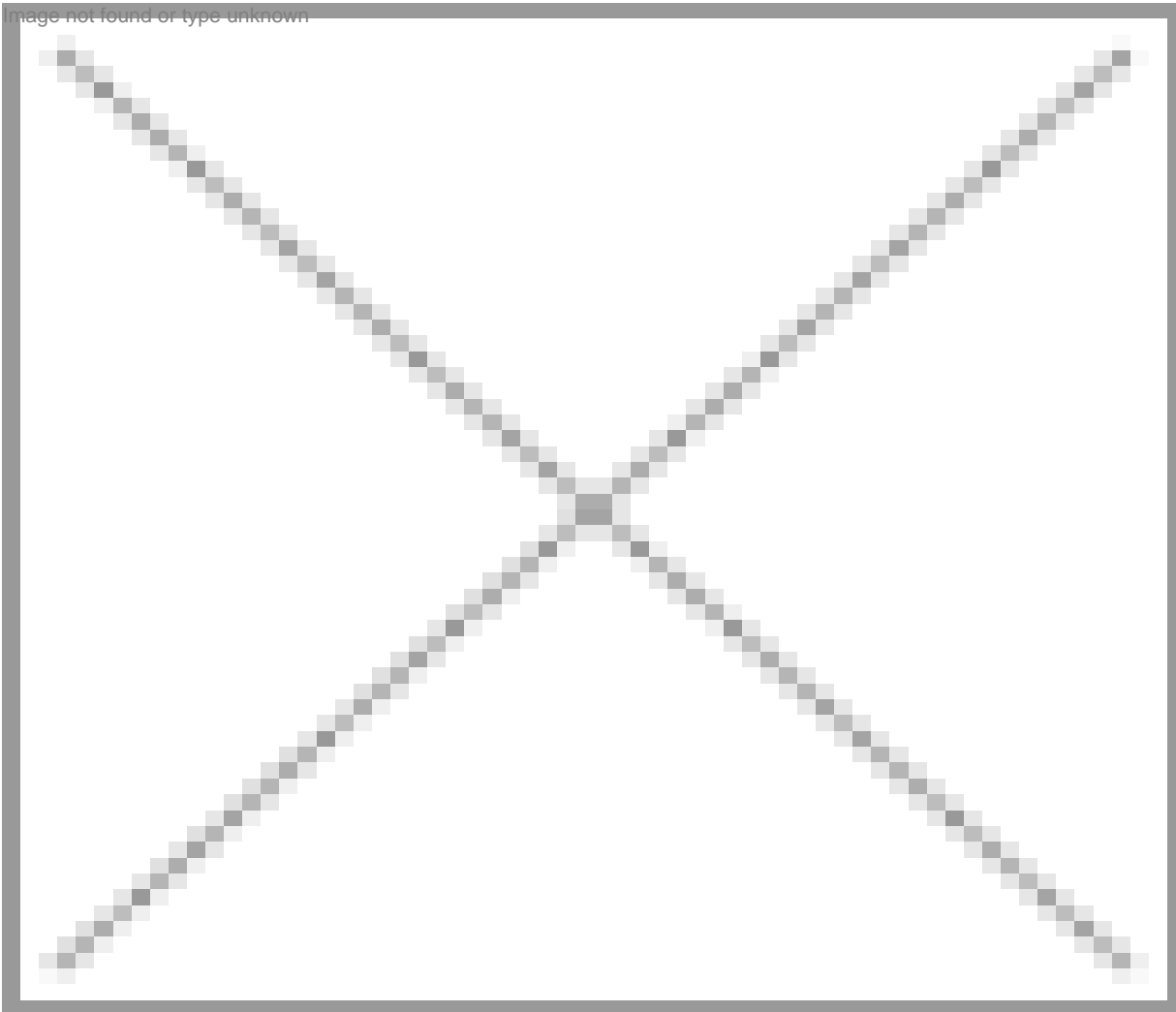


QATAR AIRWAYS BECOMES RAES CORPORATE PARTNER
