Here are some most important points Stephan mentioned:

- Sustainability in general is a good thing, as it means it is still there in the future;

- in today's operations it is very far from easy to be sustainable, its impossible;
- SAF – one of the ways to go sustainable – the planes are not yet certified;
- going sustainable – it is a vision. What we are missing – a roadmap.
- bizav needs the leverage from “big guys” – commercial aviation;
- chicken & egg situation SAF and aircraft flying on SAF;
- minimizing company's carbon emissions in every possible way;
- hydrogen aircraft for business aviation – big problem is the energy's density – I am not sure if I want to be on a hydrogen powered aircraft;
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- electrical aircraft, eVTOL – the idea behind is good, but...
- sustainability in bizav today is not financially sustainable – it is still sponsored by people who wants that;
- bad reputation of business aviation is something that should be worked on;
- business aviation needs to lead the innovation and development;
